

## Indicative

### Present

<b>I</b>	anger
<b>you</b>	anger
<b>he/she/it</b>	angers
<b>we</b>	anger
<b>you</b>	anger
<b>they</b>	anger

### Present continuous

<b>I</b>	am angering
<b>you</b>	are angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	is angering
<b>we</b>	are angering
<b>you</b>	are angering
<b>they</b>	are angering

### Simple past

<b>I</b>	angered
<b>you</b>	angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	angered
<b>we</b>	angered
<b>you</b>	angered
<b>they</b>	angered

### Past continuous

<b>I</b>	was angering
<b>you</b>	were angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	was angering
<b>we</b>	were angering
<b>you</b>	were angering
<b>they</b>	were angering

### Present perfect

<b>I</b>	have angered
<b>you</b>	have angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	has angered
<b>we</b>	have angered
<b>you</b>	have angered
<b>they</b>	have angered

### Present perfect continuous

<b>I</b>	have been angering
<b>you</b>	have been angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	has been angering
<b>we</b>	have been angering
<b>you</b>	have been angering
<b>they</b>	have been angering

### Past perfect

<b>I</b>	had angered
<b>you</b>	had angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	had angered
<b>we</b>	had angered
<b>you</b>	had angered
<b>they</b>	had angered

### Past perfect continuous

<b>I</b>	had been angering
<b>you</b>	had been angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	had been angering
<b>we</b>	had been angering
<b>you</b>	had been angering
<b>they</b>	had been angering

### Future

<b>I</b>	will anger
<b>you</b>	will anger
<b>he/she/it</b>	will anger
<b>we</b>	will anger
<b>you</b>	will anger
<b>they</b>	will anger

### Future continuous

<b>I</b>	will be angering
<b>you</b>	will be angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	will be angering
<b>we</b>	will be angering
<b>you</b>	will be angering
<b>they</b>	will be angering

### Future perfect

<b>I</b>	will have angered
<b>you</b>	will have angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	will have angered
<b>we</b>	will have angered
<b>you</b>	will have angered
<b>they</b>	will have angered

### Future perfect continuous

<b>I</b>	will have been angering
<b>you</b>	will have been angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	will have been angering
<b>we</b>	will have been angering
<b>you</b>	will have been angering
<b>they</b>	will have been angering

## Conditional

### Conditional present

<b>I</b>	would anger
<b>you</b>	would anger
<b>he/she/it</b>	would anger
<b>we</b>	would anger
<b>you</b>	would anger
<b>they</b>	would anger

### Conditional perfect

<b>I</b>	would have angered
<b>you</b>	would have angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	would have angered
<b>we</b>	would have angered
<b>you</b>	would have angered
<b>they</b>	would have angered

## Subjunctive

### Present subjunctive

<b>I</b>	anger
<b>you</b>	anger
<b>he/she/it</b>	anger
<b>we</b>	anger
<b>you</b>	anger
<b>they</b>	anger

### Past perfect subjunctive

<b>I</b>	had angered
<b>you</b>	had angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	had angered
<b>we</b>	had angered
<b>you</b>	had angered
<b>they</b>	had angered

<b>you</b>	anger
<b>we</b>	Let's anger
<b>you</b>	anger

## Participle

### Present participle

angering

### Conditional present progressive

<b>I</b>	would be angering
<b>you</b>	would be angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	would be angering
<b>we</b>	would be angering
<b>you</b>	would be angering
<b>they</b>	would be angering

### Conditional perfect progressive

<b>I</b>	would have been angering
<b>you</b>	would have been angering
<b>he/she/it</b>	would have been angering
<b>we</b>	would have been angering
<b>you</b>	would have been angering
<b>they</b>	would have been angering

### Past subjunctive

<b>I</b>	angered
<b>you</b>	angered
<b>he/she/it</b>	angered
<b>we</b>	angered
<b>you</b>	angered
<b>they</b>	angered
